WELCOME

Thank you for your interest in fundraising for Interplast Australia & New Zealand (Interplast). Fundraising is a fun and fulfilling way for you to make a difference and raise the awareness of the important work Interplast does. Your action and support enables us to achieve our mission: to enhance people's health and wellbeing by enabling access to life-changing reconstructive surgery and related medical services.

ACCORDING TO THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANISATION, OUT OF THE MILLIONS OF SURGERIES PERFORMED WORLDWIDE EACH YEAR, THE WORLD'S POOR RECEIVE ONLY 3.5%, WHILE THE WORLD'S RICHEST RECEIVE 73.6%. SADLY, TWO BILLION PEOPLE HAVE NO ACCESS AT ALL TO BASIC SURGICAL CARE.

Since Interplast began in 1983, as a partnership between Rotary and the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons, we have been tackling an element of this problem by performing free operations to patients in the Asia Pacific region who would otherwise not be able to afford or access them. We continue to build on this life-changing work by increasing our program reach and continuing to implement our 'twin-track' approach. Our focus remains on giving patients access to life-changing medical procedures whilst also building the capacity of local medical staff through a range of formal and informal training and mentoring activities.

This Rotary Fundraising Guide is designed to provide you with what you need to know about organising a fundraising activity or event for Interplast. HOW YOUR FUNDRAISING WILL HELP REPAIR BODIES AND REBUILD LIVES

Rotary funds will have a positive impact and we couldn't do what we do without you. General donations enable us to respond quickly to needs and requests. For example:

\$100 could provide dressings and surgical supplies to treat a patient after their burns surgery.

\$500 could provide hand rehabilitation services for two to three patients after they've received hand surgery.

\$1,000 could provide life-changing surgery for one or more patients in the Asia Pacific region.

\$15,000 could fund two surgeons to conduct a week-long surgical mentoring visit to Port Moresby, or send two allied health therapists to Fiji to deliver physiotherapy and speech pathology training programs.

HOW FUNDS DONATED BY D9780 WERE USED TO CHANGE LIVES

Young brothers with dreams
– The Philippines (Cagayan de Oro)

In the Philippines the Interplast team met Jeffrey aged 3, Jekli aged 5, and Rene aged 7 - three brothers with cleft lips and cleft palates. The social stigma associated with these conditions meant that all three had experienced bullying throughout their young lives.

The boys' parents worked as farm laborers earning only about \$2.50 AUD per day, and they simply could not afford to pay for surgery for the boys.

On behalf of the family, a local parish priest contacted a Rotarian who knew of the upcoming visit of an Interplast team to Cagayan de Oro. The boys made the 5-hour journey from Bukidnon with their parents to meet the surgical team, hopeful that this would be their chance at a new life. When the family arrived, the surgical team assessed the boys, and all three brothers were selected for surgery during the program activity.

In a matter of a few short hours, the lives of the boys were changed forever. All three surgeries were successful, and the brothers are now free from the stigma associated with their conditions. Jeffrey, Jekli and Rene all want to be teachers when they grow up, a dream that is now within their reach thanks to the Interplast team and local medical and Rotarian partners in the Philippines.

FUNDRAISER RESPONSIBILITIES

➔ Responsibilities as a fundraiser

- In keeping with our longstanding partnership with Rotary, a 'Letter of Authority to Fundraise' for all Rotary clubs is available at www.interplast.org.au. Where required please display the Letter of Authority to Fundraise.
- The event will be conducted in the club or district name, in an appropriate and responsible way.
- It must be clear in all communications that the Rotarians involved are raising funds on behalf of Interplast as a beneficiary.
- All publicity must state the intended use of the money raised.
- All publicity should only use the logos and photos available at www.interplast.org.au.
- Clubs and districts undertake all fundraising activities at their own risk and are required to secure any necessary permits, insurance or licenses required of them.
- Clubs & districts should note that they are not covered by Interplast's public liability insurance.
- All costs and debts associated with the fundraising activity are the responsibility of the fundraiser.
- All proceeds should be forwarded to Interplast as soon as possible by cheque or EFT.
- Interplast does not support door-to-door knocking or soliciting donations in public places.
- Interplast reserves the right to withdraw its approval for the fundraising activities should it decide that the organiser is failing to meet the above responsibilities.

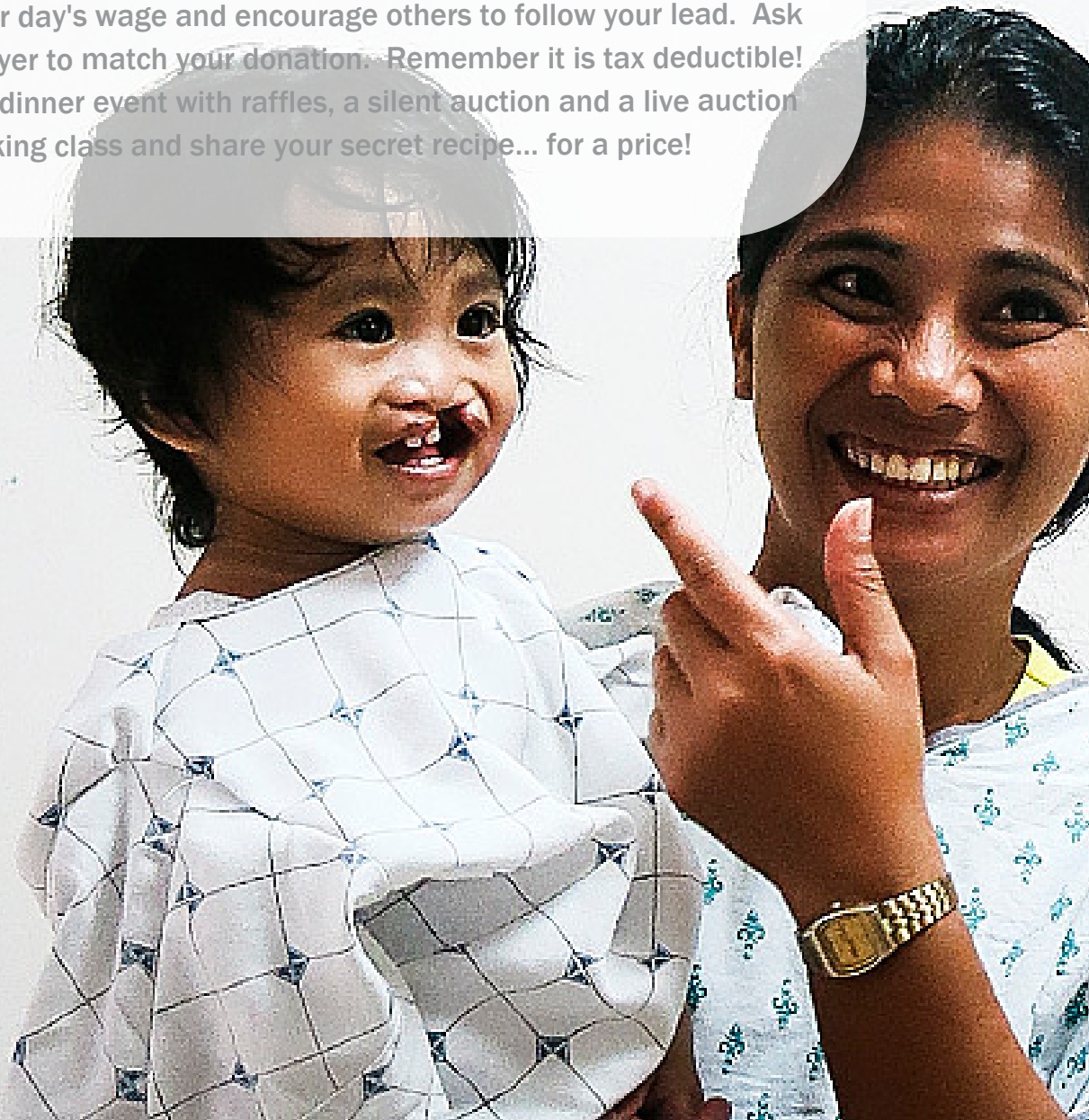
